

PRISONER OF PROGRESS

Although I have put this article under the heading of Addington Heritage, it is in fact Christchurch Heritage, but you will see it applies to our fair suburb in many ways.

Prisoner of progress may seem an improbable coining of phrase and a contradiction of terms in some readers eyes, but in six years of living in Christchurch I can think of no better way to succinctly describe my observations and experience of changes to this city's environment, its townscape, its associated loss of heritage. From the demise and demolishing of Cashel Chambers and the Flowers building at Christ's College to the controversial redevelopment of Sunnyside Hospital and the Wigram Airforce Base I have seen and heard the rumours surrounding these and other cases of redevelopment.

Residential villas have been demolished or moved to make way for infill housing. Town houses and concrete slab built office blocks take the place of established villas and gardens that have stood for more than three score decades.

For a country barely 150 years old in "European" terms that equates to half our colonial history. The landscape and the heritage of the tangata whenua has to be included in this and that stretches back to the dawn of time. Surely we need to respect and honour our past and preserve our heritage. It is what gives foundations to our identity.

In late May TV3 News carried the story of a forty year old Kauri tree in St Albans, felled before legislation to protect it was finalised. In Sydenham on the corner of Tennyson and Colombo Streets The Tandori Palace, Banfields Butchery and the 1930s period building occupied by Scissortricks are being demolished to make way for a car park for the new shops. I am reminded of Joni Mitchell's lines in her track "Big Yellow Taxi": "You don't know what you've got 'til its gone, they paved paradise and put up a parking lot". I don't want to see trees in a tree museum. They need freedom like the rest of us.

The American spokesman folksinger, Pete Seeger's song "Little Boxes" (made of ticky tacky) was adopted here 40 years ago as descriptive of New Zealand . When I look at the new Sydenham police station, the new houses on the Port Hills or in Church Bay nothing has changed. They all look just the same. This time they're sticky tacky concrete.

Surely the future of any civilized society is founded on intelligent recognition and remembrance of its past. Responsible progress respects, preserves and values its history. I suspect that without understanding this any examples of our heritage will be lost to us and we will be led captive rather than lead unencumbered.
