




ADDINGTON ACTION Organised by local residents in response to the Feb 22 quake


After the Christchurch Earthquake

The day after the February 22 Christchurch Earthquake, **Addington Action** was set up by local residents to organise the emergency effort in the 64 residential streets of Addington. Over 18 days, 150 local volunteers helped to;

- · pull down chimneys
- make a single tidy rubble pile in each street for Civil Defence to take away
- check on the elderly
- find lost pets
- deliver food and water
- provide hugs
- build long drops in public parks
- organise security

The quake brought out the best in most people and the worst in a tiny minority. On occasions, whole streets turned out to clean up the mess.

Emergency Repairs to Homes

A number of Addington homes have missed out on getting the EQC emergency repairs. These free repairs are for all homeowners and tenants including those without insurance.

The repairs make a house weatherproof so the roof doesn't leak, remove brick chimneys down to ceiling height, provide a source of heat for winter, make sure doors and windows shut, and fix pipes so that the sewerage works and there is clean drinking water.

If your home needs emergency repairs, please contact **Addington Action** who will make sure it happens quickly. As a result, most repairs are getting organised the next day.

The Next Steps

With the unfolding social disaster in Christchurch that has followed the initial natural disaster, Addington needs to get organised! The Addington earthquake volunteers are meeting in late April to make a stock take of where things are at and what to do next.

A public meeting is also planned for all Addington Residents to attend and will be held at Addington School late May or early June. Keep an eye out for publicity on power poles. Come along and have your say!
